# HCSU STRUCTURE 

## Board of Directors

The HCSU Board of Directors is made up of 7 representatives (one from each Campus), a President, a Vice President and the Executive Director. All are elected students (with the exception of the Executive Director who sits on the Board as exofficio member).
The HCSU Board of Directors sets the intention and steer the organization to ensure that each student at HCSU is represented, has their voice heard, and has the best student experience possible.

## HCSU Staff

A diverse team of individuals work to ensure the smooth operation of the SU. The HCSU consists of three full-time staff - an Executive Director, an Executive Administrative Assistant, and an Events and Communications Coordinator.

## Set goals for your club and plan on achieving them!

- Delegate duties to other officers and club members
- Monitor the progress of your club and its members
- Collaborate with club members and others to take on tasks and projects.
- Keep club members in the loop by regularly informing them of upcoming meetings and events.
- Create your club's constitution


# WHAT IS A CLUB CONSTITUTION? 

A club constitution is a written document shared with other club members that outlines the rules, regulations, and operating procedures of your club.

It provides a framework for how your club should operate and helps ensure that all members are on the same page.

For example: How many times can a club member miss a meeting? Event? This is specific to your club. You can make it as detailed as possible, or as brief as your club wants. However, keep in mind that the details will determine how changes are made to your club.

## CLUB GOVERNANCE

Your Club must include a minimum of three executive members. All executives of your Club must be full-time students at Holland College. Your club is responsible for creating designated roles for each member. Remember, add roles to your club constitution.

## Club President Role

The Club President is responsible for setting and monitoring the goals of the club, running club meetings, appointing committee chairs and delegating tasks as necessary, recruiting, and maintaining regular communication with other club members.

## Club Vice President Role

The Club Vice President is responsible for ensuring that the duties of the President are carried out effectively.

## Club Treasurer Role

The club treasurer is in charge of managing the club's finances, ensuring that all financial records are current and that funds are spent properly.

# CLUB REGISTRATION 

## For your brilliant idea to become a club at Holland College, there are a few steps you will need to take.

- Fill out the club registration form at HCSU.ca
- Your club needs:
- A minimum of ten full-time student names and ID numbers
- Two learning managers or instructors' name and email (if applicable).
- After completing the online club ratification form, the next step is to write a constitution.
- This document should explain:
- The purpose of your club,
- Outline any future plans
- Provide information about your club's members.
- It is important to take your time to carefully craft this document and provide as much detail as possible about your club's goals and objectives.
- You will then hand in all required forms either in person, at the HCSU office or by email at suvicepresident@hollandcollege.com before the deadline (to be announced)
- The Board of Directors will review the information.


# CLUB RE-REGISTRATION 

After becoming a ratified club, you will need to reregister your club each year. Re-registering your club is a simple process.

When re-registering your club, you will need to:

- send an email including your club's goals and objectives, and your club's executive members information to the HCSU Vice President
- You will not need to fill out the club's online ratification form, club's constitution, or the purpose of your club again.
